In the past year the panel, alongside Real Ideas have supported the Trust to develop a business plan, submit a bid for funding to the National Lottery Heritage Fund, develop a set of working groups, run 3 successful events, delivered marketing and comms training to community members, set up a community newsletter and much more!

#### Community Working Groups
